She is member of the Scientific Board of the IRISS CNR since 2015, member of the Board of Directors of the Della Rocca Foundation of Urban Studies in Rome, since 2009 and member of the Board of Representatives of the Italian Scientific Society of Urban Planners (SIU) since 2014.

She is currently coordinator of the AESOP Thematic Group Public Places and Urban Cultures (2017-2019).
